With this in mind, we would like to hold a School Ramble on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> October 2016 at 10.30am, to kick off our fundraising efforts. We would like anyone and everyone to join us!

If you would like to come along on a family walk, please meet at the layby by the bridge into Morton on Swale at 10.25am. We will be walking alongside the River Swale across easy country footpaths and a farm track (unfortunately not suitable for buggies, but mostly flat). We would welcome younger and older siblings, grandparents, uncles, aunties... You will need suitable footwear (strong trainers, wellies or walking boots) and a waterproof, as well as any snacks to keep you going. The walk will take between 1 – 1.5 hours (depending on how fast we walk!) ALL children must come with an adult who is taking responsibility for them (this doesn't have to be their parent, but they must be with someone you trust, please.) The very first and last part of the walk involves crossing the bridge along the main road and requires great caution – apart from that, all the walk is on paths and tracks where children can walk freely with their friends.

All we ask for is a donation to our Children in Need fundraising efforts – and this can be anything you choose to put in.

We don't need to know exact numbers, but do let your teacher know if you are planning to join us. We look forward to seeing you there and thank you for your support.
