30 Days Wild

We have enjoyed joining in with the Wild
Academy broadcast live from SpringWatch
each day this week. On Monday, the
presenters explained how to make a bug
hotel in the garden. **Annabel went straight
home and built two different habitats for
birds to feed on and for bugs to live in.**
Below is a picture she has sent in.

I wonder how many different species she
will have for a visit! It's lovely to see children
continuing their learning at home.

We are taking part in this event for the
whole of June so please let me know what
you have done for nature. Maybe you have
been on a mini-beast hunt in your garden?
Maybe you have counted how many birds
you can see visiting your garden for a set
period of time? The Wild Academy asked
children to look at the live webcam of the
bluetits nesting for a set period of time e.g.
1 hour, and to count how many times the
chicks are fed. Children were asked to make
these results as accurate as possible (note
the date, time and how many feeds) and
then send the results into SpringWatch.
How amazing is this that children can take
part in live science and have their data
included at a national level! I wonder if
anyone will take up the challenge and do
this! If you are not sure how to send in the
results, just give it to me and I will send it.
