







**Art Vocabulary - Drawing: Making your mark**

Words	RAG	Definition
<b>abstract</b>		Art that does not represent images of our everyday world. It has colour, lines, and shapes (form), but they are not meant to represent objects or living things.
<b>chalk</b>		A soft white rock used to draw with. 
<b>charcoal</b>		A material to draw with in the form of sticks. Made out of willow. 
<b>circle</b>		A 2D shape with only 1 curved side and no corners. 
<b>continuous</b>		To continue without stopping.
<b>cross-hatch</b>		Lines which go across and then over the top, go up and down. 
<b>diagonal</b>		A straight line joining two opposite corners of a square, rectangle, or other straight-sided shape. 
<b>dots</b>		a small round mark
<b>firmly</b>		with force
<b>form</b>		To make something 3D.
<b>horizontal</b>		A line that goes from left to right. 
<b>lightly</b>		Press/apply colour gently.
<b>line</b>		In art, lines can be wavy, straight, zig-zag etc.
<b>mark making</b>		to draw
<b>narrative</b>		It tells a story.
<b>observe</b>		To look carefully.
<b>optical art</b>		Art that creates an optical illusion or plays tricks with your eyes/brain! 
<b>pastel</b>		A chalk or wax based drawing material. 
<b>printing</b>		Marks made by pressing or stamping.
<b>shade</b>		A colour (or hue) which has had black added to it. 
<b>shadow</b>		Shadows make a 2D drawing look 3D. 
<b>straight</b>		A line which is free from bends or waves. 








<b>texture</b>		Is how something feels or is made to look like it should feel e.g. rough, smooth, shiny, spiky.
<b>3D shape</b>		Solid shapes like cubes and spheres. The shape can be looked at from all angles.
<b>2D shape</b>		2D shapes like circles and squares. They are completely flat.
<b>vertical</b>		A line which goes from top to bottom. 
<b>wavy</b>		Curving in shape. 



**Art Vocabulary - Craft and design: Woven wonders**

Words	RAG	Definition
<b>art</b>		The activity of painting, drawing, and making sculpture.
<b>artist</b>		Someone who draws, paints, does sculpture etc.
<b>craft</b>		An activity involving skill in making things by hand.
<b>knot</b>		A fastening made by looping a piece of or something similar on itself and it.  string, rope, tightening
<b>loom</b>		A device used to make fabric by weaving.
<b>plait</b>		A material made up of three or more strands.  interlaced
<b>thread</b>		a very thin fibre
<b>threading</b>		To put something long and thin such as string or thread through a narrow hole or into a small space.
<b>warp</b>		The threads on a loom which are then or under by the weft threads.  passed over
<b>weaving</b>		The craft of making fabric by interlacing threads.
<b>weft</b>		The threads which are passed over or under the  under the



**Art Vocabulary - Sculpture and 3D: Clay houses**

Words	RAG	Definition
<b>casting</b>		A hardening liquid is poured into a mould. When it is hard, the mould is peeled off and the sculpture is formed.
<b>ceramic</b>		Made of clay and permanently hardened by heat.
<b>cut</b>		to chop
<b>detail</b>		Interesting patterns/lines/shapes etc added to the design.
<b>flatten</b>		To squash down.
<b>glaze</b>		To cover clay with a smooth, shiny coating.
<b>impressing</b>		Make a mark by pushing down an object into the clay and then taking it out.
<b>in relief</b>		Things stuck onto the background so they stand off the picture.
<b>join</b>		To securely add 2 things together.
<b>negative space</b>		The empty space around and between the images.
<b>pinch pot</b>		A pinch pot is a simple form of hand-made pottery.
<b>plaster</b>		A soft mixture of sand and cement which forms a smooth hard surface when dried.
<b>roll</b>		To turn the clay over to shape it into a tube.
<b>score</b>		To scratch hatch marks on to the parts of the clay which need to join together.
<b>sculptor</b>		A person who creates 3D models.
<b>sculpture</b>		a 3D model
<b>shape</b>		The building blocks that artists use to create images.
<b>slip</b>		Water and clay mixed together to be used as 'glue' when joining 2 pieces of clay together.
<b>smooth</b>		a flat surface with no bumps etc
<b>surface</b>		the top part of something
<b>three dimensional</b>		The objects look real and solid instead of looking like a normal flat picture.
<b>thumb pot</b>		a small pinch pot



**Art Vocabulary - Painting and mixed media: Life in colour**

Words	RAG	Definition
<b>collage</b>		A piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as photographs and pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.
<b>detail</b>		The small elements that add to a piece of art work.
<b>mixing</b>		Putting 2 or more colours together to make a new colour.
<b>overlap</b>		Placing parts partially over and on top of another part.
<b>primary colour</b>		3 colours: red, yellow and blue
<b>secondary colour</b>		3 colours which are made from mixing 2 primary colours. Red + yellow = ORANGE Red + blue = PURPLE Blue + yellow = GREEN
<b>surface</b>		the outer layer of something
<b>texture</b>		the feel or appearance of a surface e.g. soft, fluffy, rough
